

3 – SWAZILAND STAMPS USED IN SOUTH AFRICA

Up to 1952, many Swaziland post offices were controlled by South African regional offices, such as Barberton, Piet Retief and Mkuzi, as is shown in earlier chapters. If covers from Swaziland were inadequately postmarked, then the controlling offices might rectify that, particularly on registered mail which often was transit marked anyway.

The following are an indication, but clearly not purported to be complete:

GOLLELA, 5.8.1933 MN to 27.10.1945 MN.

GOLLEL RAIL, 10.2.1932 BW to 18.11.1954 MN.

JOHANNESBURG. Machine canceller 26.8.1936 BP – this is an example of a letter entering the South African mail system not close to Swaziland.

MKUZI, 1944 BP.

PIET RETIEF, 23.4.1935 MN to 2.10.1953 BP.
