

## The Charm of Posting: POSTBOX

The first post boxes were introduced in the 17th century. By the 19th century, public post boxes became common. They have evolved over time. with different designs, shapes and materials used. Today, post boxes are a familiar sight in many countries.





# The Charm of Posting: POSTCARD

Postcards were invented in the 19th century as a way to send quick and informal messages. They became popular due to their convenience. Postcards could refer to official postal stationary or picture postcards.

In the 19th century, organised postal systems developed, leading to the creation of post offices. Today, post offices continue to play a vital role in communication and logistics, although their functions have evolved with technological and need based changes.




The Oldest Post Office in Britain - Est. 1763







# The Charm of Posting: POSTAL HISTORY










## The Charm of Posting: POSTAL SERVICES

Postal services are essential for communication and commerce, providing a reliable and efficient way to send and receive letters, packages, and other items. They are often government-run or regulated entities that operate a network of post offices and delivery services. ## The Charm of Posting: HOTEL DES POSTES

The term "Hotel des Postes" which literally translates from French to English as Postal Hotel was used extensively on early 20th century French Picture Postcards. This did not refer to any specific hospitality establishment. as the French Postal Department i.e PTT never operated any hotels. These were infact General Post Offices more akin to the French phrase "Hotel de Ville" which means town hall or city centre rather than anything to do with the English meaning of hotel.

General Post Office (GPO) is the main post office in a city or region. It handles a large volume of mail and parcels, provides various postal services like stamps, orders. money and often serves as a sorting hub for other post offices in the area. GPOs are typically located in central locations for easy accessibility.


