#### THE BEGINNINGS OF THE PHILATELIC MOVEMENT

## **FROM ROMANIA**

The printing of the first Romanian postage stamps from the Cap de bour issue on July 15, 1858 (put into circulation on July 22, 1858) and the following classic and post-classic philatelic issues as well as the internal / external postcards that circulated quickly and safely awakened people's imagination and a new hobby was born, the queen of passions, **PHILATELY**. Students were among the first to embrace the new hobby.

The exhibit pays tribute to those who founded the first philatelic society in Romania, in 1891, to the members of the leadership of the first philatelic society in Romania, to the founding members, to the members of the philatelic societies in the capital and other cities from which they carried on and continue this beautiful passion, philately.


## 1 \ 13 June 1873 THE FIRST POSTCARD FROM ROMANIA



**GEORGE I. LAHOVARY** (1838-1909) innovated the Romanian Post by introducing new, efficient and inexpensive means of communication, the mandate and the postcard, within the postal services. "The regulation to the Law on postal cards "was approved by Decree no. 945 of April 27 / May 9, 1873

The FIRST postcard put into circulation on Succession 1/13 Juni 1873, the first day of issue is a correspondence with a philatelic theme between JAQUES MORTUARY from Bucharest and M. SCHWARTFEL from Iaşi, two collectors/traders of postage stamps (the famous Cap de bour 1858, United Principalities, Cuza, Carol ...)

# 1891 Establishment of the first Philatelic Society in Romania

The first mention of a philatelic society in Romania dates from February 1891 when Capt. Constantin C. Moroiu publishes the note according to which, as a result of the agreement reached with Dimitrie C. Butculescu and two other collectors they decided to form a philatelic society, the Romanian Philatelic Society.

The first registered philatelists were Constantin C.Moroiu, Dimitrie C.Butculescu, arch .E. Wincler, Elena Moroiu daughter of C. Moroiu, Grigore G. Pascu from Codăesti, Christian Malhasovici from Botoșani and N.D. Potamiano from Focsani.

In April 1891, the formation of the Romanian Society of Timbrology, SRT and the management committee formed by president Dimitrie C. Butculescu, vice president col. J. Thorand, secretary Constantin C. Moroiu, founding members Grigore G. Pascu from Codăești, Christian Malhasovici from Botoșani, N.D. Potamiano from Focșani and C. Livadas from Brăila.

In November 1891, the Romanian Society of Timbrology, SRT reorganizes by co-opting new members in the management committee G. Bascovici, Al. Klenk, D. Antoniu; founding members were considered I. Odobescu, Th. Ionescu, G. Goranescu, Cr. Săndulescu, G. Mihăilescu, R. Biscarbon all from Bucharest, C. Dessila, Gr.G. Pascu and Saxemberg from Codaesti, P. Hette from Iasi, Christian Malhasovici from Botoșani, N.D. Potamiano from Focșani, C. Livadas from Brăila and G. Matheescu from Sinaia.

On November 26, 1891, the statute was voted on by which he chanced the name of the company in the Romanian Philatelic Society, SFR.



# **Dimitrie C. Butculescu (1845 – 1916)**

- Founding president of the Romanian Stamp Society, 1891



- He was one of the founders of the fencing hall at Jokey Club Bucharest but also the initiator of the establishment of the "Encyclopedic Society" in 1882
- He launched the first Romanian illustrated postcard at the Exhibition of Cooperators in Bucharest , 1894
- 3 times deputy in the country's Parliament , elected in 1899 President of Universal Scientific Alliance

There were some tensions between the members of the society , visible through frequent changes in the management committee but also through some acid comments from the press. The conflicts intensified towards the end of June 1892 and on July 8, 1892 vice president col. J.Thorand and the secretary capt.C. Moroiu resigns; col .J. Thorand reverts to his resignation , but Capt.C. Moroiu forms a new society under the old name of the Romanian Timbrology Society , SRT.


From July 1892 in the Romanian philatelic movement there were two philatelic societies , one led by Capt. Constantin C. Moroiu , Romanian Timbrology Society, SRT and another led by Dimitrie C. Butculescu , Romanian Philatelic Society , SFR .

In November 1982, C. Moroiu offered some explanations in Timbrophilo magazine no. 16/November 1892 regarding the division, stating that the main purpose of the society was to to procure for its members the stamps they lacked, either by purchase or exchange and that this did not happen.

The two philatelic societies in Romania can be characterized by the following ideas: its members


- The Romanian Timbrology Society led by C.M. Moroiu was very active, being involved in philatelic exchanges, purchases and sales.
- The Romanian Philatelic Society led by Dimitrie C. Butculescu had an elitist character, fact demonstrated both by the statutory provisions "people with a certain positivity in society" but also through the personalities who were invited to the steering committee.





**George Mateescu-Sinaia (1870 – 1946)** left child orphan , he started life as a shop boy to a Greek merchant , he was a photographer, editor, merchant and eventually became the mayor of Sinaia , for 20 years . From pioneer of philately became one of the most titled collectors , being the first Romanian to participate at an international philatelic exhibition ; COLLECTIONS have been rewarded with numerous awards national and international .

## Headquarters / meetings 1


Starting with 1891 the Romanian Society of Timbrology - SRT held its meetings regularly on Tuesday evenings in its premises in Baterilor street no. 41 but during the winter the meetings were still held on Tuesday evenings at the Strőbel cafe in Academiei Street.

# A woman also participated in the first meetings of the Society SRT, Eelena Moroiu, the daughter of Constantin C. Moroiu.

Αt the declared headquarters company, Bateriilur street no. 41, several Masonic institutions functioned, some of them led by Constantin C. Moroiu, but also apartments rented to individuals. After June "Romanian 1892, the Stamp Society" SRT , which had 23 members, continued its activity in January and February 1893: the meetings were held under the presidency of C. Moroiu at Café Colaro.


**Referring to Romanian Philatelic Society led by Dimitrie C. Butculescu** from a postcard, which summons all members of the company to participate in the general meeting scheduled for February 17, 1893 it follows that the Society's activity was carried out in the houses of the president, from Clemenței str. no. 13 being one of the few documents that mention this fact. There is also an envelope addressed to the "Romanian Philatelic Society", addressed to the Palace of the President C.D. Butculescu, str. Clemenței no. 11, shipped in July 1893 from the USA.







- philatelic purchases through exchange cards

- Gr. G. Pascu from Codăesti and other members offered stamps available for exchange buy

- receiving new members; " serious collectors and people with position in society ";
- stamp sellers were not admitted to society, although such a mention was not included in the regulations

# Reprints and forgeries The denunciation of Tutungiu and Capt. Constantin C. Moroiu 1

Th. Melicescu, Tobacconist and Antique stamp shop



Constantin C. Moroiu , a famous character of Romanian philatelic history , he is also the most controversial forger of postal and local stamps .

Postage stamps issued in Moldova were among the falsified ones .

C. Moroiu started making fake brands , selling them with the mention that they are not original . Despite these mentions , at the denunciation of a tobacconist , Grigore Mocioacă , on March 8, 1889, the first prosecutor of Ilfov, Boldur Voinescu , helped by several police commissioners organized a raid on the "Universul" Printing House , where Moroiu's stamps were made .

There are voices that claim that the former captain should have been arrested after the intervention of some philatelists who produced similar "deeds" and pressured the tobacconist to report them to the authorities .

It is difficult to determine what the truth is in the absence of judicial documentation .







The name Luigi Cazzavilan also appears in the research papers, the director of the ewspaper "Universul", to whom the authorities requested support in the course of the investigation.



At the end of the 19th century it was fashionable making faithful copies of rare postage stamps that have been out of circulation for a long time . Counterfeits of this type appeared following the demand from the philatelic market , being used to complete the collections of philatelists who wanted to own all existing postage stamps .

From the documents drawn up by the Bucharest prosecutors, head. C. Moroiu bought from a workshop the clichés of the Romanian stamps issued until 1872. He started making the fake brands with a printing press in the basement of the "Universul" newspaper.

After the authorities' visit to the printing house, a forced descent follows, at Moroiu's residence. Following the house search, thousands of postage stamps from Moldova, the United Principalities and Romania were found, all out of use. Despite these discoveries, Moroiu escapes. He is not charged due to lack of evidence.



An arduous search follows, the file being instrumented without the prosecutors having the jurisprudence necessary to resolve this case. During the trial, for lack of evidence, it could not be proven that Moroiu would have sold his "creations" as genuine postage stamps, as a result, he escapes from prison.

In 1881 he created a series of phantom postage stamps with nominal values of 15, 45, 90 and 135 parales, presented as hand stamps, used in Moldova in 1852-1853, but it was not successful.


In the library of the "Royal Philatelic Society" the first Romanian philatelic catalog (1886) of C. Moroiu is discovered , where he presents his works . Also in 1994 , in "Romania The Bull's Heads of Moldavia", the work of the renowned expert Fritz Heimbuchler , reproductions of these stamps are presented , as well as an original pre-philately letter sent from Focşani to Iaşi in 1885 on which Moroiu applied the stamp of his own hand , which was worth 135 parales . Another feat of Captain C. Moroiu was the one with the tax stamps issued in Mangalia at the time when he was posted , in 1883 , to the garrison in this city . My opinion is that it was an initiative of Cap. C. Moroiu who proposed to the authorities a model of Mangalia local tax stamps but which were not agreed , so they became Fakes C.Moroiu : tax stamps Mangalia .



The "deal" was somewhat more successful . He issued two series consisting of four, respectively 11 local stamps . These , although not recognized as official tax marks and do not appear in the general catalogs , are well rated and sell at a fairly high price. It is curious that for these two philatelic "issues", Capt. C. Moroiu was not investigated , although he falsely claimed that they were authentic marks .

At the end of the 19th century, the beginning of the 20th century, there were dozens of such "deals" by some philatelists who tried to take advantage of the naivety of collectors.

#### Jean de Sperati, the best forger of all time



According to inventories composed later by experts, Sperati realized eproductions of a number of over 500 brands different from all over the world. In 1954, he sold them all the reproductions that they also owned, together with all clichés and stereotypes of brands and stamps, Philatelic Association British, for an amount important at that time.
